

DOCK UPDATE

Exciting news: after discussion in December with park manager Sarah Leedy, we have finalized our location and plans for the dock. These plans were contingent on a verbal agreement that we could plan a boat house adjacent to the dock – and the park has agreed to this plan. With that in place and an approved dock permit from the TVA, we are now working on finalizing the paperwork from the park and are kicking off the fundraising for this effort. We expect the cost of the dock to be approximately \$17K and are asking each member and friend of the club to consider donating to this very worthy cause. BOATHOUSE UPDATE

We are also excited to announce that the board has begun to formulate plans for the boathouse project. Liz and Joel have been researching fundraising methods for a project of this size with input from Mary Steadman who raised money for the Boundless Playground. As a first step, we are working to develop architectural renderings of two boathouse options — one that represents a simple, less expensive design and one that is more expensive but with more options. These renderings will help cast a vision for potential donors which in turn will help us finalize a budget and ultimate design. We then plan to reach out to potential donors in the community including institutions. If you have any interest in being involved in this project, please let us know! We are very excited to be taking these next steps and will keep you informed as we make progress.

- I grew up in Northwest Arkansas and East Texas, and studied chemical engineering at the University of Arkansas, and UC Berkeley. My early rowing experience was sculling with my dad in a practice double in Arkansas and Texas. I didn't have the opportunity to row in college but rediscovered the sport at a club in Houston. I am proud to be one of the founding members of the Holston rowing club!
- Most of my experience is sculling in small boats (1X and 2X) but I love all forms of rowing.





- I have the strange (perhaps unnatural) distinction of being one of the few rowers that doesn't mind the erg. I have rowed about 4 million meters in the last three years and am focusing in on hitting the 5 million mark within the next year. I have won the men's masters division of the Tennessee Indoor Championships the last two years it has been run! Fingers crossed for a 3-pete!
- One of my most memorable rowing moments was rowing at the Hooch with Chelsea. We borrowed a boat and didn't realize the collar spread was very wrong until we were out on the water with no tools. It was challenging, and it didn't look pretty – but we got through it, and it is a great memory!
- I haven't been to the northeast regattas, but I have really enjoyed my experiences at the Hooch. Chattanooga is a great host, and it is a fun, large, and laid-back regatta in a beautiful setting. I am always inspired by the impressive youth squads represented there.
- I live in Kingsport with my wife and four children (ages 2,4,6,8) and anytime I can get out on Patrick Henry early in the morning when the water is glass, it is impossible not to appreciate how blessed we are
